Medical Volunteer Job Descriptions

Position: Licensed RN (Registered Nurse), LPN (Licensed Practical Nurse), EMT (Emergency Medical Technician), FNP (Family Nurse Practitioner), PA (Physician Assistant), or Certified NA (nursing assistant). *Note: Licensure will be checked by Carilion as all staff will be able to perform invasive finger stick procedure for blood glucose value.*

Purpose: To support this mission by being able to provide all of the following basic medical screenings for each participant

Responsibilities/Activities:

- identify participants currently on blood thinners
- review medical history for drug allergies and completeness
- blood pressure reading (use of manual sphygmomanometer/cuffs)
- blood glucose value (using lancets and Precision Xtra blood glucose monitor)
- highlight and record values; to be used in dental triage process

Timeframe: Choose preferred 3 hour shift from the following:

Friday, March 26, 2009 6am-9am OR 9am-12pm

Saturday, March 27, 2009 6am-9am

Supervision: Report to Nursing Supervisor in Medical Screening area either, Diane Hylton, RN OR Boo Pack, RN OR Edie Naughton, RN.

Qualifications: Must have licensure as stated in "Position" section. Must be able to perform all duties stated in "Responsibilities/Activities" section.

Training: Medical volunteers will receive specific training documents about Blood-borne pathogens, blood sugar testing, blood pressure screening with registration packet. Supervisors will be available on orientation night. Plan to arrive 15 minutes before your shift to sign in at medical screening area. May receive in person orientation at that time as well.

Included in orientation packet: Instructions for proper blood pressure cuff size, proper use and calibration of blood glucose monitor and basic blood borne pathogen prevention and exposure reporting process.

Benefits: May request letter during registration process to reflect volunteer hours.

Position: Pharmacy services

Responsibilities/Activities:

Counsel patients on discharge medication at exit tables.

Screen for drug allergies.

Assist dental personnel with current drug regimens.

Instruct on availability of participating pharmacies, providing maps and directions.

Provide patients with patient profiles for participating pharmacies.

Timeframe:

6:30 am to 1 pm and 1pm- 7pm on Friday 6:30 am to 12 noon Saturday

Supervision: Terri Bryant, RPh

Qualifications: Pharmacists to be licensed in the state of Virginia

Students to be currently enrolled in an accredited School of Pharmacy

Training: Any required training will be provided on site.

Benefits: Can provide documentation of hours served to your School of Pharmacy
